PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Anthropology aims at comprehending people as biological and social beings. It is concerned with all forms of people through time and space. This holistic and broad-ranging view is reflected by the presence within the Anthropology program of four branches or sub-fields: Archaeology, Biological Anthropology, Cultural Anthropology, and Linguistics. Exposure to anthropological information and the cross-cultural perspective produces heightened sensitivity in the student to the world about him/her. This helps the student to adopt an intellectual posture of disciplined skepticism with respect to any scheme that purports to define and account for regularities in human life. Students majoring in other fields may find Anthropology coursework an exciting and valuable supplement to their primary academic interest.

CURRICULUM:

A. Student Learning Outcomes:

Goal 1: Discipline Specific Knowledge

- 1a. Outcome: Anthropology majors will be able to identify, articulate, and apply concepts central to the anthropological perspective (culture; human evolution; cultural diversity; biological diversity; language; gender/sex; cultural relativism; holism; historical and cross-cultural comparison; globalization).
- 1b. Outcome: Anthropology majors will demonstrate an understanding of work in applied and academic anthropology, and to position themselves for employment or advanced study after graduation. Students should demonstrate the ability to 1) identify a path for post-baccalaureate employment or study; 2) write a clear and effective cover letter or statement of purpose for the career of their choice; and 3) develop a curriculum vitae or resumé appropriate in style and content for their chosen career.

Goal 2: Communication Skills

- 2a. Outcome: Anthropology majors will demonstrate effective written communication skills as indicated by the ability to compose a research paper, literature review, or essay with clearly articulated ideas, using correct grammar and spelling, and supported by appropriate citation.

Goal 3: Critical Thinking Skills

- 3a. Outcome: Anthropology majors should demonstrate the ability to research and write either an anthropological research paper or essay 1) with a clear thesis, 2) supported by

relevant documentation and a logical progression of ideas that explain the thesis and successfully persuade the reader.
